## A God Who Draws Us

School is starting, and summer is drawing to a close. The days are starting to get shorter, and our normal schedules are resuming with the necessary pandemic precautions. The summer season is often a time when we break out of our normal routines. Many people take vacations and trips, and we find time for a variety of summer activities. It is good to have a break from our normal routines. While I enjoy summer, the fall has always been my favorite time of the year. I enjoy the changing of the seasons. The cooler evenings and the changing leaves seem to draw me to the fall each year. We are all drawn by a variety of things in our lives. Sometimes we are drawn to a season or by a particular event or by a special occasion.

When I was just a boy, I began to sense God's presence, and I began to sense him drawing me to him. I grew up in the church. My father was called to a small mission congregation in north Missouri just prior to my birth. Obviously, as the son of the pastor, I was involved in everything that happened at church. I learned all the traditional Bible stories as a child, and I was one of the children the teachers could always call on for all the right answers. But, one Sunday during a worship service I began to sense something new. I began to understand that the stories I knew were not merely interesting stories. They were stories about God, but they were also stories about me. I began to see myself in the stories, and I began to sense God speaking to me from the stories. I began to sense God tugging on my heart and life. I shared my thoughts and experiences with my parents, and they provided wise and patient encouragement without rushing my decision. One evening at home several months later following a revival meeting at church I shared with my father that I wanted to accept Jesus as my personal Savior. We prayed together, and as a boy I invited Christ into my heart and life.

Someone once told me that becoming a Christian is committing all you know about yourself to all you know about God and letting your commitment grow. Obviously, I know more about God today than I did as a boy. I have also learned a lot about "Jim" that I did not know as a child, but my commitment of my life to Christ was real and life changing. That first tugging upon my heart and life that I felt as a child was not the only time God has drawn me to himself. Many times throughout my life God's Spirit has used circumstances or scripture or the words of a friend to speak to me. He used the words of a friend in college to help me begin the process of discerning my call to ministry. He has often spoken to me with fresh words from the pages of the scripture.

The Christian life is a journey of faith. With each new day he speaks to us in so many ways, helping us to know him more deeply, and leading us to discover his will for our lives. He "draws" us to himself. Sometimes we are listening, and we sense his Spirit drawing us. Sometimes we miss his invitations. I hope you will join us for worship on the Lord's Day as bring our praise and we listen for his call.


