A Journey through the Season of Lent Dr. Jim Hill, Interim Senior Minister

There is something special about observing the seasons of the Christian year with brothers and sisters in Christ. Gathering for worship each week, we remember that we have joined with Christians throughout the ages in offering praise to God for the gift of new life. This week Christians around the world begin their observance of the season of Lent. It is a time of preparation for the incredible celebration of the resurrection of Christ at Easter.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. "Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his public ministry. Our Ash Wednesday Worship service officially launched this special season for our church family. Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter," and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

For many Christians, Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. In our culture fasting is not a popular tradition—at least not as a means of spiritual preparation. Our culture is pretty obsessed with food. In any event, Lent is a time of self- examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others. I believe it is a wonderful season for reflection as we consider the sacrifice of our Savior, and as we reflect on Christ's call for all of his disciples to take up their cross and follow him. Maybe most of all, Lent is a time to reflect on our relationship to God.

On the first two Sundays of the Lenten season, I will be sharing messages from the Psalms that are part of our lectionary scripture readings. This Sunday we will share from Psalm 91. It is a beautiful psalm that is often read or incorporated into the music of worship. I look forward to sharing with you on the Lord's Day.

This Sunday the church family will also say 'good-bye' to Rev. Sarah Kingsbery who will be concluding her ministry with First Christian Church. Sarah has faithfully served this congregation for more than six years. I has been a personal privilege to serve with her during this interim period, and she has been an incredible help to me as I served as your interim senior minister. The church family will host a reception for Rev. Sarah at 9:30 a.m. this Sunday, March 6, between the morning worship services. I know you will want to be present to express your appreciation for her ministry and to wish her well as she seeks God's direction for the next stage of her ministry.

I also want to encourage you to continue to pray for the Search Committee. I know they are working hard to discern God's will as they seek the person God is preparing to serve as your new senior minister. It is a challenging task, but God is faithful, and I am confident God will lead your church family as you prepare for the future. I hope to see you in worship on the Lord's Day.

A Message from Rev. Sarah

Beloveds,

The time is fast approaching when we will say good-bye to each other and I will no longer be your Associate Minister.

This Sunday will be my last with you all. As part of worship, we will share in a Litany of Farewell. As part of that litany, we will release one another from this mutual relationship we have shared as minister and congregation. With the end of this pastoral relationship comes expectations and boundaries. While difficult, these come as recommendations from the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and other denominations and are for our mutual benefit.

- * I will no longer be your minister. I will not provide support during pastoral emergencies, offer pastoral counseling, visits, calls, or texts;
- * I will not return to officiate at funerals, weddings or baptisms;
- * I will not discuss church business or happenings with you;
- * I will no longer receive internal church communications.

You may also notice changes to my Facebook presence. Social media can be a wonderful ministry tool for connecting and sharing information but it can also complicate these boundaries. After my last day, I will stop most interactions with church member Facebook posts. This does not mean I do not love you and care about what is happening in your life. It is a difficult area to separate out the pastoral relationship and so I will be erring on the side of honoring the boundary. After a year or so, especially after new ministers have had a chance to develop relationships with you, some of these social media connections may be renewed. These guidelines can feel abrupt and cold but they are grounded in the wisdom of the church's experience and in my care of you. After March 9th, it is important for you to remain open to building relationships with the ministers you will call to serve you. I have benefited greatly from being able to build relationships with you in moments of celebration and in moments of crisis. I wish this same gift for those who will follow me.

It is also true that these boundaries are for me as well as for you. God is calling us to separate and independent futures. Just as you all are now tasked with calling new ministers, I have to figure out what it means to no longer be Associate Minister of First Christian Jeff City and devote my time and energy to discerning where God is calling me next. This separation is needed for those things to happen.

Please know that I will still be in Jefferson City for the time being. If you see me out and about, you are welcome to say hi and speak to me about subjects that are not related to ministry of First Christian Church.

My prayers remain with you, as I trust God will know what you all most need even when I do not.

I am grateful for the many ways you have supported me and offered me care, love, and compassion. I hope you will share these same gifts with your future ministers. Trust that even as I step away, God is caring for me through the support networks I have outside this congregation. In return, I will trust in God's care and guidance for you through the talents and gifts in this congregation and those you will call.
