Dear FCC JCMO Family,

One of the most enjoyable parts of pastoral ministry, for me, is the opportunity to spend time in the company of church members. Last week, I had several opportunities for that. I made my way to two different hospitals to share a visit and a prayer with folks. I hung out with the food pantry crew for a while on Tuesday. Wrangling carts for the pantry is always one of the highlights of my week. I love working with the other volunteers and being able to send off our guests with a smile and a "Have a great day!" On Wednesday, I was able to fill in at the Noon Bible Study, so that the usual leader, David Avery, could attend another meeting. We had an interesting discussion about parables and seeds and soil.

On Thursday, I was fortunate that the Faith Seekers group invited me to join them on an excursion to Branson. We broke bread together at a delightful restaurant called The Ozark Mill, then continued on to the Sight and Sound Theatre, where we saw *Queen Esther*. The sets and costumes were amazing and, of course, the story was divine, but the stories and laughter shared among the group that day were even better!

Saturday evening, five adults took twelve youth group kids in a caravan of vehicles to the Moberly Five & Drive Theatre where we took in the movie *Inside Out 2* on the Drive-In screen. If you're unfamiliar with the original Inside Out, it's a movie that centers around the personified emotions (Joy, Fear, Disgust, Anger, and Sadness) of a little girl named Riley whose family moves across the country. Her primary emotion had been Joy, but with the major change in her life, Sadness became more prominent. Eventually, Joy learns that Sadness is an important part of the emotional make-up, which helps Riley build empathy.

In the sequel, Riley is a teenager and a whole new set of emotions (Anxiety, Envy, Embarrassment, and Ennui) arrive on the scene and take over. Anxiety exiles the original emotions and threatens the core identity that Riley has built over time (that she is a Good Person and a Good Friend.) Ultimately, Riley has to figure out how to manage all these new feelings and decide which one will be the leading influence in her life. Spoiler alert - at the end, Riley calls for Joy to take over the controls again and learns to listen to Anxiety without letting her rule.

For most of the group, it was their first time seeing a drive-in movie, but for a few of us, it was an opportunity to relive childhood memories - cue Nostalgia (another emotion mentioned in the film.)

While it wasn't a faith-based film, there is certainly a faith lesson we can learn. As Christians, our "Joy" is found in Christ and in the freedom we have in belonging to him. We don't have to worry about measuring up or fitting in with the "cool kids," because we are already fully known and loved by the God of Everything! Hallelujah!
